The following documentation must be provided to determine eligibility for future loans:

1. Physician’s certification/statement that you have the ability to engage in substantial gainful activity. **This documentation must be provided on the physician’s office letterhead and include physicians medical license number.**

2. Sign the following statement and certify that you understand that any new federal student loan cannot later be discharged for any present impairment unless it deteriorates so that you are again totally and permanently disabled.

I, _____, acknowledge that I previously had a student loan(s) cancelled due to total and permanent disability*. I further acknowledge that my physician has certified my impairment(s) has improved sufficiently so that I now have the ability to engage in gainful activity defined as able to work and earn money or attend school. I also acknowledge the student loan I am now applying for and may receive, and any subsequent student loan(s) I may apply for and may receive hereafter, may not be canceled due to any present impairment(s) unless my physician certifies the impairment(s) has substantially deteriorated to the point of total and permanent disability*.
