Bible studies

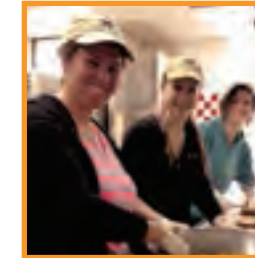
Reconnect with the Bible and learn how to see the world as God sees it. Contact the Campus Ministries Office for Bible study dates and times.
