

CRRSAA Student Quarterly March 31, 2021 Report

1. Friends University acknowledges that it has signed and returned to the Department of Education the Certification and Agreement for Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students under the Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act (CRRSAA). Friends University intends to use no less than the required amount of funds received to provide Higher Education Emergency Relief Funds (HEERF) grants to students.

2. Friends University has received a total of \$509,039 from the Department pursuant to the institution's Certification and Agreement for Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students.

3. As of March 31, 2021, the total amount of Emergency Financial Aid Grants distributed to students under CRRSAA was \$0.

4. Friends University had received guidance at the time of the award that being a United States Citizen was the criteria for receiving an Emergency Financial Aid Grant to Students. Using this criteria, it is estimated that the eligible number of degree-seeking students as of March 30, 2021 was 1250.

5. As of March 31, 2021, the total number of students who have received an Emergency Financial Aid Grant to students under CRRSAA was 0.

6. The methods used by Friends University to determine which students receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants and how much they would receive under CRRSAA was still being determined as of March 31, 2021.

7. A student who is determined to be eligible to receive an Emergency Financial Aid Grant to students and is awarded a grant based on the Friends University allocation methodology will receive received a Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund Grant Acknowledgement of Financial Need and Acceptance of Funds letter that will accompany the grant check that will be mailed to the student's permanent home address on file. That document is still being composed as of March 31, 2021.
